

AMA (WA) members recognised in King's Birthday Honours List

Several Australian Medical Association (WA) members have been recognised in the King's Birthday Honours List for 2026.

Professor Timothy Davis was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) for distinguished service to medicine as a consultant physician; to clinical research into diabetes and infectious diseases; and to tertiary education.

Dr David Joske was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for significant service to haematology; and to pioneering the use of integrative oncology.

Dr Sean Stevens was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for service to general practice medicine.

AMA President Dr Danielle McMullen congratulated the members on the significant recognition of their contribution to the health of communities across Australia.

"All of the doctors have shown great dedication to using their skills and experience to benefit patients, colleagues, and society as a whole." Dr McMullen said.
